authority or state agency. An abandoned car with no plates, that means it could be sitting on public property just for six hours. And at the end of six hours, under 1902, it appears that it would be deemed to have been abandoned in those conditions, and title would vest immediately with the authority designated to pick it up. Is that accurate so far?

SENATOR BROMM: So far.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR BROMM: You have to then go to 1904, 60-1904...right.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Tell me...describe for us this then, what is the difference between being able to take title to an abandoned car of 250 or 500 or less, depending on what we do, and the process of notice for taking title to one that is more than that? I'd like to understand what difference is involved between the two types of vehicles? Because it appears to me that, with regard to the 250 and less, or 500 and less, depending on what we do, and especially if it has no current license plate, the taking of title is very...the transfer of title is very easy. Is that accurate?

SENATOR BROMM: If it's of less value?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah.

SENATOR BROMM: Yes, it's very easy.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR BROMM: And if it's a higher value vehicle, then you follow the procedure on 60-1903, at the bottom of the first page of the committee amendment, and on through the...about two-thirds of the next page, which has a process of...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, let's take it in two parts, if we may.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: If it's \$500 and less, what do you have to go
