estrangement, situations where people don't live together, so the notice may not...they may not...the good party, the person that needs the car and has done nothing wrong may not have the opportunity to recover it, because they wouldn't get the notice. So my question is, would you have any objection to making all of the words "owner" plural, "owners", so that anyone who is registered on the title would receive notice insofar as there may be a separate address or a way of separately identifying such a person?

SENATOR BROMM: I don't think I would have any objection, Senator Beutler. The address, I believe, and the names that are involved would be off of the registration of the vehicle. And normally, you have just one address. You might have John and Mary Jones, but you have one address, you know. You don't have multiple addresses, so I don't know if that.... If you would permit me to do so, I would take a closer look at that before this bill comes up again and discuss that with you to see if there are any implications of doing that. I would have no objection, other than I don't want to add confusion to it.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Right, if always and every time it's just one address, I suppose my suggestion doesn't help anything. But I would appreciate if you'd take a look at that.

SENATOR BROMM: We will do that.

SENATOR BEUTLER: And in line with this thought also, thinking generally about what good faith efforts should be made to give notice, that's one area for exploration. The other thing that bothered me a little bit was the fact that, if the car didn't have license plates, the only thing that was required in terms of an investigation was to simply go to the Department of Motor Vehicles,...

SENATOR COORDSEN: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...I think, or, if it's in another jurisdiction, to whatever their Department of Motor...equivalent...Department of Motor Vehicles equivalent would be. My question is this, if there's identification in the car some way other than...are they bound to follow-up on that
