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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, when I attended Tech High School, many years ago, I had an English teacher whom I really respected. And she was in a wheelchair. She was a member of the Christian Science Church. But the irony is that she wore eye glasses. And as a child I thought that was so ironic. I'd like to ask Senator Wehrbein a question. Senator Wehrbein,...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...because I missed what you said, did you say you know some people who are Christian Scientists and would need the benefit of this amendment?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: No, I did not say specifically.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I was just aware that there are, based on what I've read in the paper over the last few years, there has been occasional concern. That's what I meant that I was aware. I have no specific knowledge that I can recall.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you know whether any Christian Scientist would go to the dentist, if he or she had a decayed tooth?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: No, I do not know any of that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. I'd like to ask Senator Bohlke a question.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Bohlke, would you respond?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Bohlke, do you know whether or not Christian Scientists go to the dentist?

SENATOR BOHLKE: The Christian Scientists that I know, I believe, do not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If a Christian Scientist had a broken leg,
