I think that as intrusive as the state is where it ought not to be, in my opinion, where we're talking about the rights of women and the personal sexual conduct of adults behind closed doors, the government...some people...my colleagues they want to stick their nose in people's crotches to see if there's a protuberance or an opening. They want to put their ear to the wall to see whether people of the same gender are doing things of which they don't approve; put their eye to the keyhole to see what they can see in people's bedroom. They feel that's all right, and I don't. When it comes to the little children, the class whom Jesus, that you all apparently believe in, because you all usually have somebody up there every morning praying and saying "in the name of Jesus", He's the one who said, bring these little children to me. And it's like little children that people must be if they want to populate heaven. Some of his disciples even got irritated because he spent so much time with these children. And you Christians are no better in your Christianity than that man over there called Johanns is. He follows the church when it says abortion is wrong, because that is a popular political position. But when the Pope says, states, stop killing, then that same individual says, well, although in the bed of a pickup truck I saw John 3:16, that told me to get saved, he said, well the Pope can go...well, he didn't say that with words, but his attitude was, my religion is like a supermarket, I take what appeals to me at the moment, and that's the way I feel about what the Pope says. If he says a position should be taken that will hurt me politically, by God, I'm not going to take it. But if he says, take a position that helps me politically, I'll take it and say that's my churches belief, and that's why I take it. That's what I kind of see in the way that we deal with these children. When it's convenient to talk about children as a means to get benefits for teachers and school administrators, we trot out the children. When these hypocritical congressmen, who may have lived as dirty a life as Clinton, want to go after him, they say, what are little children going to think? Always the children. Then when it comes to the physical health of these little, innocent, helpless children, we want to say all of a sudden...
