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SENATOR DIERKS: ...that's, in essence, what they're saying is they can utilize their staff better and still do the job.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I didn't follow the part about the six month inspections, is that for all eating establishments?

SENATOR DIERKS: That's for what they call low-risk establishments, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: For the low-risk establishments.

SENATOR DIERKS: They are talking about warehouses and that sort of thing.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. So this Section 18 applies only to low-risk establishments or does it apply broadly to all inspections?

SENATOR DIERKS: I think that we're talking about the low-risk establishments in this particular section, Senator Beutler, and the food establishments I think they are talking about are warehouses and, what are some of the others, where they have prepackaged goods.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. I think I need to go back and get a better understanding of this area, Senator. I'll cease with the questions at this point in time. Thank you very much for...

SENATOR DIERKS: Certainly.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...responding.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Janssen, please.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. Senator Beutler, I believe that I can help you clarify a little bit there what they are talking about. If they have establishments, warehouses, or whatever it might be, that are...they consider more at risk, they would have more time to go to those...to those establishments that have a poorer track
