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the TERC board, this is one of the few boards out here, and actually it is not a board, one of the few functioning regulators that...it'd be similar to the Public Service Commission. That's about the next closest thing I can give you as an example. It's an issue of fairness where she is taking her salary in order to serve, and I don't think it's particularly fair. The members of the Revenue Committee saw fit to agree with that, advance the bill out. This would allow for out-of-pocket expenses not to exceed the appropriation that's made in here. That would be...the fiscal note is \$7,478, so roughly \$7,500 a year. That claim would have to be done through the Department of Administrative Services, DAS, as anyone else, and it is for actual expenditures, so it is not a per diem. It would be done similar to what we have to do. She would be required to have rules and regulations put in place and adopted by the TERC to do this. I think that it is a matter of fairness and one that we should have done when we originally created the TERC board, but we were more interested in the substance instead of how the actual policy for the commissioners to do. And for her, I think it's the right thing to do. There is a threshold of 80 miles. So if someone from the third district lives within 80 miles, we think that's probably a reasonable commute distance and would not allow any of the living expenses, if you lived within 80 miles, so there is that provision in the bill. I'd be happy to answer any questions and would hope that we could process this bill this morning.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. Senator Wehrbein, please.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. Speaker and members of the body, Senator Kristensen, I have a couple of questions. I support this bill and I understand the need for it. I do wonder, do you know, are you aware of other commissions that we may have with similar circumstances? And the first question might well be, I know her, she is in the third district, I can't remember, is there a requirement for them to be across the state necessarily?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Yes, there is.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: So that does explain that, and are we doing this in other areas? So I'm looking at it as a precedent or...
