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about or relating is lawful and appropriate, it may continue.

SENATOR SCHMITT: It would remain the same. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Schmitt. Chair recognizes Senator Schimek, on the committee amendments.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. Senator Brashear, I rise because I just want to raise this issue and tell you that I'm going to look into it further. But several years ago this body passed legislation which called for an established Child Death Review Team. And this is an added step onto that particular process. What I would like to look at is see where we are with those Child Death Review Teams; if it would even be necessary for us to still have that, if we're actually going to go ahead and do the autopsies. And I don't know if you or your committee actually looked into that at all while you were examining this issue? It wouldn't necessarily come up in the course of conversation, I suppose.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Brashear.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Senator Schimek, yes, we did look at that. It was in fact the people who are involved with the Death Review Teams who participated, in a very significant way, in the interim study, recommending and urging that this standard be adopted.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Excellent. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Brashear, you're recognized. Senator Brashear waives off. Seeing no additional lights, Senator Brashear, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. President, members of the body, I urge the adoption of the committee amendment. It's absolutely necessary to have a fully comprehensible bill to advance. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator. The motion before us is the adoption of the committee amendments. Those in favor
