**SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** You heard the closing. The question before the body is the adoption of the Baker amendment to LB 59. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted who care to? Senator Baker.

**SENATOR BAKER:** Can we call the house, please?

**SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** There's been a request to place the house under call. All those in favor...favor of voting, placing the house under call vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record.

**CLERK:** 26 ayes, 1 nay to place the house under call.

**SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** The house is under call. Would all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Would all senators please report to the Chamber and record your presence. The house is under call. Senator Don Pederson, Senator Matzke, would you please record your presence. The house is under call.
