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it is the Legislature has declared the policy of the state to be. "State building" may, in some people's mind,...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...be unambiguous and clear. If the matter went to court, the court may provide a definition and the court may say that a state building is any building in which the state has an interest, if the state owns it, if the state leases it, either to or has a building leased to it. But we know that if the state leases a building that already is a state building because the state retains ownership. The only thing that people, if they're thinking, could wonder about really is a building leased by the state. Any...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time. Chair recognizes Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Members of the Legislature, I think the only way to interpret what's happened is to say that we've identified, in something we've already put on the bill, additional problems, and the question now is whether we advance the bill to Select File and everybody who has thought of additional situations presents those for consideration at Select File or whether we stop at this point. I think what I will do is refile my amendment so that, in the event that nobody else files amendments on Select File, at least we clarify what in fact is meant by what we've done. We obviously don't know as a group what we meant, I think is the problem. So I will refile this amendment on Select File and everybody who has thought of situations that they think should not be covered by the Tyson amendment probably should be getting together and...and identifying those things they want to exclude out. I might say that even beyond these three situations that we've identified so far, that is buildings owned by, leased to, or leased from, there's yet an additional situation out there if you intend to protect all state employees. Was that your intent, to protect all state employees? Well, in the Clerk of the County Courts, all of the people who work in the Clerk of the County Courts' offices are state employees and they work in county owned buildings, so we're not even protecting all state employees. Furthermore, those who work in the Clerks of the District Court may someday soon, hopefully, be state employees, and you would
