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it, this access, would be under this general language here, which nobody seems to know what it means.

SENATOR JENSEN: Senator, I'd be glad to work with you on Select File to come up with some proper language that perhaps...and maybe you might be right that...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But, see, I don't know what it's for, so I don't know what to tell you proper language would be. Let me ask you this, did any of the medical providers comment on this language during the hearing and explain why they thought it ought to be in the bill?

SENATOR JENSEN: No, not that I can recall.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Who requested it, other than maybe it having appeared in some other bills that had been introduced?

SENATOR JENSEN: I don't know. Maybe we could bring Senator Coordsen.... Senator Brashear is not in here. Will you...what we did is take the...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR JENSEN: ...the language of the three bills and combine them, and certainly this is not language that we came up with on our own, the committee did not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And it wasn't in my bill, LB 71.

SENATOR JENSEN: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I just want to clean myself up.

SENATOR JENSEN: (Laugh.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Jensen. Members of the Legislature, on Select File, because I don't want to delay the bill at this point, maybe there is a legitimate reason for this language, which escapes me at this point, but, if I'm not shown compelling reason for having this language, I'm going to attempt to remove it on Select File and, by me expressing this
