PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Seeing no further lights, Senator Jensen, you're recognized to close on the committee amendments to LB 17.

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I would be certainly glad to work with Senator Coordsen and anyone else between now and Select File on this amendment, and...but I would urge at this point in time that we do advance the amendment to LB 17. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Jensen. The motion before us is the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 17. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I would like to thank Senator Wehrbein for bringing a concern about a section of what is now LB 17 that is quite inconsistent with the language of LB 17, and I look forward to working with Senator Chambers, Senator Jensen and others in narrowing this particular section of what is now LB 17, because the comments that were made with regard to this phrase, I think, need further exploration. However, having said that, I would then recommend to the body at this time that we advance LB 17 to E & R for initial. Thank you.
