SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Jensen, a question, if I may. The committee amendment indicates that it should be revenue neutral with regard to the General Fund. I'm vague on how the process works and perhaps just need a description of that. But my question is essentially this, the money that's put up or put into the program for purposes of attracting the federal money, that has to be revenue neutral. The fiscal note also talks about additional costs of support services, such as child care for parents in treatment and transportation cost to services, have not been included in this fiscal note. The implication of that seems to be that there will be some costs associated with those particular types of items. Does the prohibition or the admonition or the direction to keep the proposition revenue neutral refer just to the money that's being put up to make the federal match, or does it look at all costs that are to be incurred as a result or likely to be incurred because of a result of this and the amendment would pertain to all of those associated costs?

SENATOR JENSEN: It would pertain to the total cost related to the...from the Department of Health and Human Services. Whether that would be child care or whatever, all those costs will be included into it.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Any cost that results from picking up the option to any...any degree?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. And then my second question is what...what services will not be done? If there is a transfer of funds in order to do this, what services are being provided by picking up this option and what services are going to be given up, if monies transfer? I guess I would be interested in knowing what the trade-off is on this.

SENATOR JENSEN: And, Senator Beutler, I cannot answer that question. I'll be...certainly look that up and get back to you, but I do not know at this time.
