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convenient form of doing things, of doing business.

SENATOR LANDIS: The answer to that...my answer to that question is, yes, and I'll ask to see if I'm wrong.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR LANDIS: Yes, that's correct,...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Putting...

SENATOR LANDIS: ...there isn't a new transaction that couldn't otherwise be done by teller.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Putting...putting the example another way, right now, at least until another bill is passed, there are certain types of insurance that banks cannot deal in.

SENATOR LANDIS: Right.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I doubt if you would be issuing insurance policies from an ATM. But, would...would...

SENATOR LANDIS: That's right, if a bank is foreclosed...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...this broad language dealing with this subject legitimize doing something like that, that was beyond your current scope of authority?

SENATOR LANDIS: My answer is no, if banks are foreclosed from doing that, you can't use an ATM to get around that prohibition.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. I'd be...I'd be interested in clarification that. Thank you. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Beutler, your light is next. Further debate on advancement of LB 396? Senator Landis, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature. The department was in, the Banking Association was in, they were supporters. It was reported out unanimously. In
