SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: You've heard the closing. The question before the body is the advancement of LB 396 to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 396.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: (LB) 396 advances. LB 91.

CLERK: LB 91, Mr. President, by Senator Cudaback. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 7, referred to General Affairs Committee, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Speaker Kristensen and members, LB 91 is a rather simple bill, but it's rather very important. It deals with the State Electrical Act. And I say simple because it's brought to us by the board and it deals with the National Fire Protection Association. Every three years they go through and update the code. And in our statutes it says, "the board shall be governed by"; it says "shall be". So we, every three years we go through and adopt what the National Fire Protection Association did in their updates.
