SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Debate on the advancement of the bill? Senator Cudaback. He waives closing. The question before the body is the advancement of LB 91 to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays. Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 91.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: LB 91 advances. LB 360.... Excuse me, before we move to the next bill, any items for the record, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I do, Mr. President, thank you. Enrollment and Review reports LB 170, (LB) 191, (LB) 259, (LB) 278, correctly engrossed. Enrollment and Review also reports (LB) 363, (LB) 20A, (LB) 202A to Select File. I have hearing notices from Transportation Committee; from Natural Resources; and from the Banking Committee, Mr. President. That's all that I have. (See pages 494-495 of the Legislative Journal.)

CLERK: (LB) 362, by Senator Hartnett. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 13, advanced to...referred to General Affairs. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, what LB 362 is permissive legislation, would allow two or more bodies, cities, villages, townships, or counties, at the request of their county boards, to establish a library federation.
