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on your amendment.

SENATOR HARTNETT: This amendment was brought to me by the counsel of the Revenue Committee which said we had it in the wrong section, it should be in Section 77-3442, which deals with miscellaneous levies of political subdivisions. We had it, and all it does is change from 77-3443 to 77-3442. That's all the amendment does. It was brought to me by the counsel of the Revenue Committee. So he's on lookout for all...dealing with levies.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Debate on the Hartnett amendment? Senator Hartnett, your light is on? Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Hartnett, just a couple of questions, if I may. This bill and the next bill that's coming down the pike begin to complicate the idea of merging agencies and merging groups and merging tax levies. And I'm...I...I want to step back and talk about a little bit why we need so many different ways of doing things, and whether ultimately, in our effort to provide some flexibility to governmental units, we might not be creating complexities that get to the point that people throw up their hands and say, well I can't understand anything that's going on here because I don't understand who controls, I don't understand who's working together, I don't understand where the money is coming from, and I'm picking on you a little bit, because I think most of those things are clear in this particular piece of legislation. But we started out this whole process with the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act. And I thought that under that act, it was pretty broad, you could essentially get together and make whatever agreement you wanted to make. And now we have two further complicating ideas. And there may be more, I'm not sure I have a grasp on all of them by any means. But this one seems to be an interlocal operating agreement kind of format, but it deals with libraries. And the next bill coming up, Senator Wickersham's I think, is another form of interlocal cooperating agreement, I guess. We can discuss that at the time when the bill comes up. But I guess my first question to you is, are we going to go through a process now that will continue for a number of years whereby interlocal cooperating kinds of agreements relating to particular entities, like libraries, for example, will have
