PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator, I now have your amendment that you just briefly described, AM0235, in front of me. (See amendment on page 485 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Chair recognizes Senator Bruning.

SENATOR BRUNING: Mr. Chairman, members, I won't take any more time on the amendment. As I mentioned, it deletes three words, to make sure the bill does exactly what it was designed to do. It should have...it's basically a drafting error that we should have taken care of when we first put the bill together.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator. For discussion on the Bruning amendment to LB 340, the Chair recognizes Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Bruning, if you would yield to a question or a little discussion on the amendment, please.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Bruning.

SENATOR BRUNING: Yes, Senator.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Senator Bruning. And this is the first that I'm looking at the amendment. And I...and it is...does appear to be rather minor in taking out three words. But I'm wondering if it's necessary, because, as I read the language of the law as it exists, I thought that those words pertaining to the vehicle or trailer that follows these words "at the time a vehicle or trailer is displayed and being offered for sale". Now, I didn't think that referred to the display of the information that you're not going to display anymore, but going to retain on file in the computer and so forth. I thought that language pertained to the displaying or making available for sale the vehicle or trailer. Would you...would you please address that or tell me how you're reading the language of existing law.

SENATOR BRUNING: Senator, with the amendments, essentially this particular section of the bill, what it does is it says, as the
