Nebraska Retirement Systems Committee recommends for your confirmation as the Director for the Nebraska Public Employees Retirement System Anna Sullivan. Ms. Sullivan comes to us with an exceptional resume'. She has worked for the Nebraska Public Employee Retirement System since 1976, and has been acting Director since July of 1998. The committee believes that she will make an excellent addition to the Nebraska Retirement System. This appointment was approved by Governor Johanns, in January of 1999. Her confirmation hearing before the Retirement Committee was held on February 3, 1999. The committee asks for your support and approval of this appointment, and I request a record vote. Thank you. And I'd be happy to answer any questions.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'm grateful that Senator Stuhr, a woman, is offering us this morning the appointment of a woman for confirmation. So I'm able to vote "aye" on this one.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I, too, stand in support of this nomination. Anna Sullivan has done an excellent job in her tenure there at the commission, and she will continue to do so as the director. I hope that everyone will confirm her with a positive vote, because it is a good selection we have made. Thank you.
