with the weed and seed program. It is a federal program and it is administered by the local police department, and it is available only in urban neighborhoods, and only in design...areas that have been designated as weed and seed areas. So it has very, very limited scope, and it has also some goals that are much more narrow than what this program seeks to do. Senator Hartnett doesn't have maybe necessarily organized neighborhood groups, but he does have actually a lot of neighborhood watch groups. So sometimes neighborhood watch groups operate in the same kind of manner as neighborhood...same kind of way as neighborhood association groups. Also one comment that I wanted to make is that the Department of Economic Development is already responsible for administering a number of small grant programs--the Nebraska Community Improvement Program, the Urban Community Improvement Program, and, of course, the Partnerships...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.

SENATOR KIEL: ...for Economic Development.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Kiel, your light is the next one.

SENATOR KIEL: Okay. So when we are talking about the costs of administration, I believe that certainly the costs of administering this program would be absorbed into administering Senator Vrtiska's...I guess I should call it his program, but anyway the program that is in his bill. I do not believe you would see additional costs to administer the Neighborhood Development Grant Program that would be put in as part of his bill. One of the things that I want to reiterate and emphasize is that this is intended to provide some economic support to the improvement of neighborhoods and small communities. It is not a top-down program, it is a bottom-up program. The program is administered and the work is carried out by the people who live in the small communities, it's carried out by people who live in the neighborhood communities. Those people plan the program, they apply for the funding, and they carry out the program. Current grants tend to be for large scale programs and high dollar amounts. What this program does is give smaller groups the funding to start to make a difference, and those differences can be anything from fixing up the restroom in the neighborhood
