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have to first defeat the committee amendment. We'd have to first have the bracket motion pulled, we'd have to defeat the committee amendment, and then vote on my amendment to strike Section 2, which would allow us to focus on very important parts of the bill that I know you and others are concerned about. Would you consider accommodating that?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I will. Mr. President, I would ask unanimous consent to withdraw my bracket motion.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: If there is no objections, the bracket motion is withdrawn.

SENATOR BROMM: If...thank you, thank you, Senator Chambers. If the body would see fit, I would ask whether or not people would consider turning their lights off and letting me...ask the body to vote red on the committee amendments as step one. Then we can get to my proposed amendment to strike Section 2. Do you have other lights following mine? Okay, well, I guess I won't take any more time. If people do turn their lights off, I'll ask the body to vote red on the committee amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator. The Chair recognizes Senator Bruning. Senator Bruning waived. The Chair recognizes Senator Kristensen.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Mr. President, Senator Bromm, in fairness to what we're going to do at eleven-thirty for Senator Beutler and his motion to pull, I know what we're trying to accomplish. I want to accomplish the same thing, but for the purpose of the schedule, I need to be fair to Senator Beutler to give him his time and I don't think it's...it's three minutes until that occurs. If we want to vote down the committee amendments, that's fine, but we need to stop at eleven-thirty. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator. Seeing no further lights, Senator Bromm, you're recognized to close on the committee amendment.

SENATOR BROMM: I would simply ask, Mr. President, that people vote red on the committee amendments.
