SENATOR JANSSEN: No, this would be an ongoing.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Ongoing.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. It indicates that...it indicates that there would be a review of plans and specifications on any property structures or improvements that may be proposed to be made available by gift, bequest, or device. The language just seems...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...curious to me.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Why is it...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ..."made available to"?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Let...let me give you an example, Senator Beutler, if I may. Say that there is a building that is in need of a roof. All right, and the person who is going to give or donate to the state, bequest to the state, this building is going to, let's say, is going to put a new roof on it, all right, prior to giving it to the state. We're asking for a review or to look at the specifications of that particular room that the "bequestor" is going to give to the state to make sure that it is the right, let's say, roof that is being put on and that it is not going to deteriorate or blow off or leak within a year or six months to a year of that after the building has been donated. That is what that means, that we would review any improvements to those buildings prior to accepting them.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Remind me what the law is right now. Who, when there's a gift or device or otherwise of real property to a state agency, board or commission, is it different in
