PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...are we interfering with the...with the legislative or administrative branches.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Beutler, you're recognized,...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Let me...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: ...followed by Senator Janssen.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...let me continue with you for a moment. Let's say that there was as split of opinion as between the Governor's staff's analysis and the 309 Committee's review. Would that preclude the Governor from accepting the matter, from accepting the building?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, it would be up to the Governor and the Legislature. I believe the Legislature also has to approve that, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. So it doesn't require any approval from the task force but is designed to inform the task force so that if it's sent forward for legislative approval they would be informed on the matter? Is that the idea?

SENATOR JANSSEN: That...yes, that would be it. The...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...task force would be one more catch to find if something is wrong. After reviewing any construction that has...repair or maintenance that's...that has been put on a building, reviewing it, seeing if it is done the correct way, and then report those findings to the Legislature and the Governor's Office for approve...for final approval.
