PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The bill is advanced. LB 163A.

CLERK: (LB) 163A by Senator Hilgert. (Read title.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Hilgert, you're recognized to open on LB 163A.

SENATOR HILGERT: Yes, again, this is going to be...there...Senator Wehrbein gave a good explanation of the A bill. Frankly, the fiscal note is \$38,433, is revenue neutral with the inspect...will be funded through inspection fees. With that, I would ask the body to advance 163A. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator. The Chair recognizes Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, once more, between now and Select maybe, John, you could look at see if they could absorb this. I...I don't know if you've pursued this in detail. That's always a possibility. I don't know anything about the numbers of additions that...inspections they'll have to do or how widespread it could be. It would make...help the bill make more sense if we didn't have to add another person, but I also understand you have to be realistic and I just want to call the body's attention to the fact. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator. Seeing no further lights, Senator Hilgert, you're recognized to close on the advancement of LB 163A.

SENATOR HILGERT: Only to say, Senator Wehrbein, I certainly will look into that. There's 424 locations that the fiscal note says will have to be inspected, but we will look into that between now and Select. I appreciate your comments and ask the body to advance LB 163A.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator. The question before us is the advancement of LB 163A. Those in favor vote aye; those opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.
