with the costs that would have to be paid. It's a very innocuous bill. It doesn't do anything that is earthshaking and I think we should advance this bill. And I hope what I said does not muddy the water.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Brashear, on LB 689.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Madam Chair, members of the body, just to avoid anything as Senator Chambers muddying the water, this is the second time; 1997 and this session your Judiciary Committee brought this bill, which we thank Senator Robak for carrying, brought this bill unanimously to you. It is fair. It is right, and it avoids procedurally trapping the unwary. There is no reason not to advance this bill. I urge its adoption. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Brashear. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Madam Speaker and members of the body, I was wondering how serious the A bill note is on this in additional staff. May I ask Senator Robak about that.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Robak, will you yield for a question?

SENATOR ROBAK: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Is there any been discussion...has there been any discussion with the Attorney General on this, or is there a way this could be absorbed within the agency?

SENATOR ROBAK: The Attorney General did not testify at the hearing for or against. He was not at the hearing. We did read the fiscal note too. We do not agree with the fiscal note because of the fact that I guess he is referring to inmates, which do file in forma pauperis.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR ROBAK: I hope that...
