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SENATOR D. PEDERSON: That's correct.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay, thank you. I support the bill and would encourage the body to advance it. It would simply make it a lot more economical for people who find themselves with a...sometimes almost a negligible value of a lot or something in order then to enable them to transfer it easily and economically. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Crosby, members of the Legislature, Senator Pederson, a couple of questions, if I may.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Pederson, will you yield once more.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I have been out this morning, and I am sorry, maybe this has already been asked, but just a couple of details with respect to what I think is a very good bill, too. Let me...it wouldn't be very often, I don't suppose, but when the process involves land in more than one county and there is a provision in there that it be filed in both counties,...

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...which would make sense. I was thinking I read in the committee statement that the register of deeds was supposed to file it in the other county, but is it your intent that the claiming successor would be the one who'd be responsible for filing in any additional counties that needed to be filed in?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: It's to be delivered to the register of deeds for recording.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, so...

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: So it's the responsibility, I would say, of the person who is asking the register of deeds to do
