SENATOR D. PEDERSON: My assumption...you're more familiar with title insurance companies than I am, but it would be my understanding, probably, that the title insurance company in certain circumstance would require the filing of a death certificate to accompany perhaps the affidavit.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Thank you, Senator Pederson.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Thank you.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Redfield.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Thank you, Madam Chairman and members of the body. I do have a question for Senator Pederson and it does involve the time frame, the 30 days elapsing after the death. I had a question just because I know that circumstances are very different for families when they face a death, and sometimes they are very distraught, and it's hard for them to make decisions in an instant time frame, and so, of course, we want to allow enough time for them to make good decisions and find out what details they have to attend to. But one of the other concerns I have is sometimes you have survivors, children, nephews, nieces, who come from out of town and they are trying to settle up all those loose ends while they are here in town, and not having to go back to the expense of travel to come back again. And I was just questioning the time frame, if you could give me the reasoning on this, and if this takes into consideration all of those details?

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Pederson, will you yield once more.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Yes, yes, I will. The 30 days is actually piggybacked on top of the 30 day affidavit that we have for personal property. It's the same time segment, and it simply says that 30 days must elapse from the date of death before this can...this can take place. And oftentimes in the probate proceeding, you will have family that will gather at the time of a funeral. They will understand what is going to happen. This requires that everybody who owns an interest in this piece of
