SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator...I'll ask this question of Senator Schimek, because her amendment goes to this public building idea.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Schimek, would you respond?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schimek, by removing the terms "primary public", now any building could be used for this purpose. Is that true?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: That is correct, Senator. There would have to be public notice, however, so that the people would know where this teleconference was being held.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Could it be a big shot's house?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Sure.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Could it be a country club?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Sure.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Could it be a country club to which certain people might not be welcome?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No, I think it has to be a building that would accommodate the public.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But not all the public is invited...is allowed to join country clubs, is that true?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Then I would say that you couldn't have it there.
