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quickly. What I think you need to do, and I'm certainly not going to do it, but I really do think it should be bracketed for awhile and come back with some ideas and some real reasons for doing this. I haven't heard anything this morning that makes me think we have some big emergency and that we need to do this. So I'm going to vote against the amendment and I'm going to vote against the bill. I haven't helped anybody, I'm quite sure, but I just have a strange feeling about this this morning. Thank you.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: The Chair wishes to announce that Senator Smith has guests under the south balcony: Nadine de Bacco and Suzi Baird from Gering. Would you please rise and be recognized by the Legislature. The Chair also wishes to announce that Senator Wickersham, the Chair, has guests in the north balcony. They are a group of very important persons from Chadron, Alliance, Hemingford, and Crawford. Would you please rise and be recognized by your Legislature. Senator Schrock, you're recognized to speak to the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would like to thank Senator Chambers for his input and for this amendment. It makes sense to me. And I appreciate Senator Crosby's remarks, but I don't think we are doing things correct in this state as it pertains to the Governor and Lieutenant Governor. I think they should be a team and people are placed in awkward positions now when it comes to the Governor and the Lieutenant Governor trying to run as a team and trying to work as a team after they are elected. Senator Crosby, you know, we attended a victory party for the 413 opponents and Dick Herman spoke to us, and he spoke to about a lot of shenanigans that were taking place by the Lieutenant Governor when the Governor was out of state. And if you had two of those people as a team, that wouldn't have happened. There's been senators appointed to this legislative body by the Lieutenant Governor because the Governor was out of state. If you have two people in those positions who are not in harmony, it can cause the Governor a lot of grief, to the point where the Governor may not even dare leave the state. I don't think we want that. I think we want a lot of trust between our Governor and Lieutenant Governor and I think from that standpoint the Governor candidate is going to select the best person, regardless of the party, as their
