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was a situation to prevent, in the general election, the public having the option of voting for a Governor of one party and a Lieutenant Governor of another party. So, when that provision was put into the constitution, the ballots would put the Democrat for Governor and the Democrat for Lieutenant Governor on one spot on the ballot, and a vote cast was a vote for both of them. The same with the "Repelican" side--a vote for one was a vote for both. What this is that we're talking about now is entirely different. It's a departure from the way a Lieutenant Governor is selected. A Lieutenant Governor, in a sense, can be deemed elected at least by running in the primary. There will be no hint of an election for a Lieutenant Governor under the amendment being proposed here today. So, if you're going to create a new system where the candidate for Governor does the selecting, leave the field as open as possible under the constitution when we add language. I'm not changing anything by my amendment from what Senator Schimek had read. When the names appear on the ballot, there still will have to be one vote cast for the candidate for Governor and Lieutenant Governor of the same party on one ballot, the candidates for Governor and Lieutenant Governor for the other party on the other ballot. So this language I think should be adopted. Lieutenant Governors generally become anonymous, unknown persons. When one of the Adams, there was a daddy and a son who became President, and I forget which one was which, Senator Quandahl, when this happened because that was a long time ago and my memory gets a little shaky after all that time, but he was Vice President first and he said, after he'd been in that office for awhile, paraphrasing: my country, in its wisdom, has contrived for me the most useless, meaningless, worthless office conceived in the imagination of, he probably said, man. Lieutenant Governors have a way...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...of becoming anonymous. I even had to ask my seatmate, Senator Price, who the Lieutenant Governor was under Bob Kerrey so that I could tell you this story. I'll do it on my close, 'cause I won't have enough time here. Thank you, Mr. President.
