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its gambling under the auspices of St. Bingo. The frilly collars, Senator Redfield, can have their gambling in the form of the office pools. But the frayed collar, the blue collar and the no collar cannot have their gambling through sports betting. Horseracing, live horse racing is a thing of the past in Omaha, and I'm so glad of that. I was greatly opposed. All of the stupid forms of gambling are allowed where the odds against your winning are astronomical. Those types are allowed. Sports betting where, through some study and application, you can increase your chances of winning is disallowed. There is no other form of betting where the odds are so good for you as in sports betting. You either win or you lose. You bet on two things, one or the other. Betting at random you have a better chance than with horseracing, lotteries and bingo. So why is that form illegal? Because when you want to deal with suckers, you want to have a sucker enterprise, so they allow them only to engage legally in sucker betting. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, and Senator Schellpeper, as always, I'll vote against this bill. It has nothing to do directly with your amendment, because I don't even understand it. But if there's anymore discussion, I'm going to try to figure out what it says. And then, if I can't, at this point, I'm not going to try to delay the bill, but between now and Select File I will try to get from you what it does. And I did listen to you, but I'm just not clear on what this bill is about.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Crosby, you're recognized.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Mr. President and members. I'm going to vote no, too. And it's sort of a symbolic vote for me, Senator Schellpeper, because I do have a lot of people in my district that just don't like anything having anything to do with gambling, plus they don't want to enhance it and to make it easier. So, I just want you to understand why I'm probably going to vote no. But, the other thing, I have some of the same feelings that Senator Chambers does about it. And I do want.... No, there isn't any St. Bingo, as far as I know. I think that's a dog, Bingo. Isn't some dog named Bingo? But in our diocese, as it happens, I hardly...I don't think there's any, any, as far as I know, big bingo games going anymore because we have a diocesan development program which helps finance our schools and
