SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schellpeper. We are now voting on the advancement of LB 479. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Mr. Clerk, record.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Mr. Chairman, I would ask for a call of the house, and take call-in votes, please.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 17 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The house is under call. All members record their presence. The house is under call. Senator Coordsen, will you check in, please. He says, no. Senator Wehrbein, Senator Kiel, Senator Wickersham, Senator Tyson, Senator Raikes, Senator Quandahl, Senator Bromm, Senator Bruning, Senator Bourne, and Senator Lynch, would you please check in. The house is under call. Senator Schellpeper is authorizing call-ins, so we are taking call-ins.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Senator Bohlke voting yes. Senator Schmitt voting yes. Senator Lynch voting yes. Senator Raikes voting yes. Senator Bourne voting yes. Senator Kiel voting yes. Senator Bruning voting yes. Senator Wickersham voting yes. Senator Robak voting yes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 4 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: LB 479 is advanced. And I do raise the call. Next item, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: LB 234 was introduced by Senators Suttle and Schimek. (Read title.) The bill was read for the first time on January 11th of this year, referred to the Government Committee.
