When he tells us to vote, next time, will he say, "All those in favor vote A; all those opposed vote B"? (Laughter.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: (Laugh.) Any other lights on? Seeing none, Senator Suttle, to close.

SENATOR SUTTLE: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the Legislature, during the committee amendments it was discussed that the year 2000 still may be a worry. I just wanted to assure you that all of this is on...backed up with...with software. And I don't believe the Douglas County Commissioner plans to do anything, until after the year 2000, with the number of hard copy files that she has. So I wanted to assure you of that. And nothing will occur that will lose all of our information. And, with that, Mr. President, I will close. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Suttle. We are now voting on the advancement of 234. All those in favor vote aye, opposed...red. Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: LB 234 does advance. Mr. Clerk, next item.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, LB 802 was introduced by the Government Committee. (Read title.) The bill was read for the first time on January 20th of this year, referred to the Government Committee. I do have amendments from the Government Committee attached, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schimek, you are recognized to open on the bill.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. (LB) 802 is a bill that was brought to us by the Secretary of State's Office. And they brought it to us because of some issues raised by local election officials. And I'm just going to reiterate for you some of the provisions for the bill. They're all pretty noncontroversial, I think. The bill allows clerks of the election to perform all of the duties that a judge
