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access to those pieces of paper, I think we'll all be served, in terms of accountability and the information that citizens may want about their local governments or about other local governments...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: ...that they might want to compare theirs to. Thank you, and I'd be happy to respond to any questions.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wickersham. We are now open for discussion on the committee amendments to LB 806 (sic). Those wishing to speak would be Senator Wehrbein, you are now recognized to speak.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. Speaker and members. I'd like to...I...I heard part of what you said, Senator Wickersham, and I think you said you took the fiscal note out of it by what you were going to do.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: No, there would still be...there would be an A bill, and it would call for \$115,000 in fiscal '99-2000, and \$108,000 in fiscal year 2000-2001.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And that's the staff for auditors?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That...yeah...well, okay, yes, and that...and some computer equipment or programming. That is not related to the advisory board, I want to make that clear.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That is related to changes in the internal processes of the Auditor's Office that would be necessary to implement electronic filing of budgets and the building of a data base so that we would have greater access to the information that is already being filed there.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay. Is this...been anticipated, or is strictly from your bill? I'm just wondering how this fits into the other budget requests?
