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SENATOR WICKERSHAM: The bill does not require that change.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: The bill does not require that change, but I would certainly recommend that change to this Legislature. It doesn't require that.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: The State Auditor's Office could already develop electronic filing, could already develop the data base, but does not have the resources to do it.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay. I will be looking at that in light of the other part of her budget. Thank you.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yeah.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Bruning.

SENATOR BRUNING: Mr. President, members, I rise in support of the committee amendments and I want to thank the Revenue Committee for allowing one particular part of the committee amendments that allows certain governmental subdivisions to use a cheaper form of debt. In my district, the Springfield Fire Department purchased a truck with a 4 percent loan, and that was not...they weren't able to make the payments suddenly, they weren't, of course, schooled in the ways of state finance and how our levy limits work. Under this bill they will be able to continue using that cheaper form of debt. And, for a subdistrict that has a \$50,000 annual budget, the difference between 4 percent money and 8 percent money is pretty significant. So I wanted to rise in support of the committee amendments and thank the Revenue Committee for its help in that regard. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bruning. Next speaker, Senator Schimek. Senator Schimek waives off. Any further discussion on the committee amendments to LB 806 (sic)? Seeing none, Senator Wickersham, to close on the committee amendments.
