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SENATOR JONES: Madam President, I'd just like to have a little conversation with Senator Baker, please.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Baker.

SENATOR BAKER: Yes.

SENATOR JONES: I was going to give example and see how...what you think. I need a tractor and absolutely on the place and I need to go buy it, and I would go to the bank and borrow all the money for it and set that up on payments, and then you're saying then that they'll add the depreciation back in for the child support then on...

SENATOR BAKER: That's what they're...that's what they are doing now.

SENATOR JONES: And this would exempt it, because that is not money that you've got available, because you probably had to borrow all that money...

SENATOR BAKER: That's right. It's...

SENATOR JONES: ...to do that.

SENATOR BAKER: ...a legitimate expense of doing business.

SENATOR JONES: So then you'll, on top of that, you're going to have payments and you're going to have interest on that money on top of it, so that the money you have available should not be included in the depreciation. That's what your bill actually does, right?

SENATOR BAKER: Well, I'm...the bill states that they will not add depreciation back on to your adjusted gross income, to figure your guidelines for child support. It...

SENATOR JONES: Thank you. And, with that, I can relate to that real good because I set up a hog unit on my place and borrowed the money at the bank and that's set up on a depreciation. I needed that for the operation, to make the operation work, so I
