could be sold, therefore restricting those that are listed for sale: motor vehicle liability, underinsured, uninsured, accident and health in relation only to the rental car, personal property insurance in relation only to the rental car, and lastly, it restricts the rental car company...rental company from paying additional compensation to an employee for the sale of insurance to a renter. All of these things were discussed as a result of the hearing. The bill came out of committee eight to nothing. There were no opponents and a number of people testified, in a neutral capacity, to explain the bill, including the Department of Insurance, Independent Insurance Agents of Nebraska, and the Professional Insurance Agents of Nebraska. And, with that, I'd ask for your support of the amendment.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Lynch. Is there any discussion on the committee amendments? Seeing none, Senator Lynch, did you wish to close on the committee amendments? Waives closing. We are voting on the adoption of the committee amendments. All of those in favor say (sic) aye; all of those opposed nay. All of those in favor vote aye; all of those opposed.... Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of committee amendments.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: The committee amendments are adopted. We turn to discussion of the bill. Is there any discussion? Senator Lynch, to close on the bill. Senator Lynch waives closing and we will vote on the advancement of LB 424 to E & R. All of those in favor vote aye; all of those opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 424.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: LB 424 advances, and we turn to LB 324, and, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, 324, a bill introduced by Senator Jensen. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 12 of this year, at that time referred to the Health and Human Services Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I
