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inclined to support Senator Beutler's amendment which takes it back before the Tyson amendment, with the understanding then we'll try to come up with a compromise before Final Reading. At the very least what I would want to do then is to take the original amendment that I had and specify designated smoking areas, so that that would lower that. So, I guess, at this time what I would like to do is support Senator Beutler's amendment that he has now, with the understanding then that we'll go forward and try to come up with a clean compromise agreement that certainly won't hamper Senator Schmitt's bill and will be agreeable to all parties, and cover those entities that we specifically need to cover, without enlarging the issue now. Thank you.

**SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** Senator Schmitt.

**SENATOR SCHMITT:** Yes, Mr. Speaker, members. I, too, rise to support Senator Beutler's amendment, and I wish to thank him for bringing it to us this morning. This will bring it back to the original bill. And I also talked to Senator Beutler and, if this is advanced from Select to Final Reading, between now and then, if this can be worked out to where it's agreeable with everybody's concerns here, then I will accept that. I don't have a problem with it. I think Senator Preister, with his amendment, addressed quite a few of the concerns. There may be a few things that need to be worked out with his amendment, and I think maybe he's on the right track, other than the pickin' and choosing, which Senator Peterson talked about. But I would just ask for your support of Senator Beutler's amendment now. Let them work together and see what we can come up with between now and Final Reading and then go ahead and pass it. Thank you.
