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might want to think about. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body. Again, I will...also would like the bill to return to its original form and then add the Beutler amendment. Many of you know that the simulcasting at the State Fairgrounds is an area where a lot of people go for their enjoyment, and many of them smoke. And I, as much as I abhor smoking and don't like to be around where it is, I understand that this could actually be the destruction of the State Fair, if we are not able to hold simulcasting out there. And there are people who smoke out there. So what we're doing is somewhat what Senator Landis said, we're getting into an area where we're starting to overstep maybe our bounds by passing laws that will be something that is going to be very difficult to administer and to enforce. I will not support the Preister amendment, simply because it starts to take out those pieces and we don't know where to stop. And I think to put it under the management of those people who control those facilities is a much better way to go and so, given that circumstance, I will support the Beutler amendment. Hope that you can move it forward and perhaps, in another...at another time we can revisit this issue, and in the meantime, it would be my hope that we could spend more time on educating people, particularly young people to stop smoking or not start smoking so the issue would not have to be addressed by the Nebraska Legislature. With that, thank you very much.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Schellpeper.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. I rise to support the Beutler amendment also. But I think we need to take a very serious look at the Preister amendment. Whenever you start to list different agencies and different buildings, you're going to leave somebody out. I think the State Fair is a very good example. They have their beer gardens in some buildings, and they also have their simulcast in a couple different buildings. You just can't do that. I think you need to take a look at what the original intent of the bill was, and that's the State Capitol. Let's pass the bill in the original intent, and then come in with something else when you have a
