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bracketing it to a date certain in order to let everyone get together off the floor and solve this, which sometimes may be a better way of addressing issues rather than trying to pull something back from Final Reading. I haven't...I don't think there's a sense of the body, maybe, to support Senator Preister's amendment, but still wanting the bill to go forward. I am very interested in the issue of the cabins. I do think that they're different from the other residences and lodging. I think it's something that we could come together and have some discussion and probably get something done on Select File, if we would bracket to a date certain. As my time ends, I may file that bracket motion, but I wanted to talk to Senator Schmitt and see if that is something he would find workable rather than trying to pull something back from Final Reading. And so, I just wanted people to know my intentions, my concerns, and that I think we can accomplish what a number of people want to accomplish, if we have some time off the floor to work it through. Certainly Senator Preister's bill has had a number of public hearings, so the issues addressed in that have had opportunity from the public to come forward and have a public hearing. And the amount of discussion we had on General File and we're having here today certainly does not make this any stealth bill or stealth amendment that I know none of us would want to be open to criticism on. But I do think it's an issue that I would like to see addressed. I think Senator Preister's amendment has possibilities. But I would like to see the area of the cabins and the rentals at state parks be omitted from that amendment, but I'm willing to work with people off the floor and see if we can get this resolved before moving it to Final Reading. Thank you.

**SENATOR THOMPSON:** Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I rise in support of Senator Peterson...or Preister's amendment, excuse me. And I think it's good we're having this discussion. I've been working on another bill with the Clean Indoor Air Act. And I would just like to make a couple of comments about some of the proposed changes that have come up today. First of all, I think it's important that we keep enforcement of clean indoor air, and the Clean Indoor Air Act in state government in one agency, and that currently is the
