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any necessity to do it, Senator Byars wants to pour gasoline on this fire because he is determined that he is going to save lives and this is the way to do it. And then if some cop gets shot, then he and others will stand up and talk about what a terrible thing it is and it doesn't matter what the provocation was that the cop engaged in. Well, what I'm going to do with my colleagues before we finish debating this bill, and I want to get it in the legislative record, because I'm always seeking federal investigations and don't have much success in getting them with reference to these police killings, an exchange between me and a captain from the Omaha Police Division about how the cell phone of a black man who was shot by some cops wound up in the cruiser of the cops who shot him, and nobody knows how it got there, including the two cops who did the shooting. Then after I bring some of these things to your attention, I'm going to...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...see if you feel the same way that all we're talking about is putting seat belts on people.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Schmitt.

SENATOR SCHMITT: Yes, Mr. Speaker, members, I rise again, I'm probably not going to talk on this issue too much more, but sitting here listening to the conversation this morning, I think there's a few things that probably need to be brought out. Right now with the mandatory seat belt, if you are stopped for some other violation, you can be ticketed for it. I ask you, how many times have you seen in the paper where someone was given a ticket for not wearing her seat belt as an adult? Rarely. One of the big reasons for that is most county attorneys will not prosecute for not wearing a seat belt, and if it gets through the prosecution, most judges don't want to see seat belts in front of them. We've got a lot of laws out here that are not enforced by law enforcement because of lack of prosecution and lack of what the judges are doing as far as handing out penalties from the bench. Senator Crosby, I think, brought up a very important issue with the cell phones. How many people in here would support making it illegal to drive down the road with a cell phone, talking on it? Very few. Why?
