Asian individuals, I will do so. And, Senator Hartnett, you understand. You've been here for many years. The width of a road, the condition of a road, the drifting, they're going to happen. Accidents are going to happen. We're going to try in every way possible to encourage people to make changes that will prevent that from happening, but those accidents are going to happen. What I'm talking about is what happens after the accident. What happens after the accident? If you don't have a restraint on your child, if you don't have a seat belt on yourself, your chances of survival, your chances of serious injury are substantially increased after you drift, when the road is inadequate. And statistics time and time again, relative to those who are wearing restraints, those who are not, don't discriminate. Wearing or not wearing of seat belts and buckling our children, restraining them properly is an answer. It is a solution. And I'm looking for other solutions. If there's something that I'm missing here relative to the safety of the people of this state, please, please tell me. This isn't a bill to discriminate. This is not a bill, in any way, that is going to try to give law enforcement officers more opportunity to harass any individual, black or white or Latino, but it absolutely is to save lives. And, Senator Chambers, when people on this floor approach me on healthcare issues of all sorts, I'm there to help them. I would be there to help you, as you had asked. As anyone doesn't understand the system as well as I am fortunate enough to understand it, I will help them in any way that I can. And it won't make a difference to me whether they've opposed me on this piece of legislation or others. I will still help them because they need help. That is my disposition. That is the reason I am a member of this legislative body. That is the reason I will passionately continue to support this piece of legislation, and I thank you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, nobody on this floor can sway me from my position on this issue.
