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healthcare issue in which he will take an interest which does not command the interest of a substantial number of these senators from the very beginning. Senators often, when they have a lot of company, will take a position. I'm going to read something that Senator Kerrey said, U.S. Senator Kerrey, said before the Ag Committee so you'll understand why I have to use the method I do on issues such as this. This is from that hearing that we had on February 2nd. "SENATOR KERREY: Well, again, I would answer, yes, there is concern, but there is something unusual going on. That's why I tried to emphasize this dual economy. It's almost like you have two economies going on right now. And you have to present, pretty forcefully and pretty repetitively, that what's going on in agriculture is unique. It sets us apart. It sets us apart." It is unique. And, because of that, the arguments on behalf of this unique aspect of the economy must be presented forcefully and repetitively. He talked about a dual economy. Studies have been undertaken repeatedly that show in America there is a dual society, one black, one white. But when we talk about the dual economy that is hurting white producers, we have U.S. senators who come to the state to speak out. Senators on this floor and, as members of the committee, will speak out, and I, who have to face the same mockery that they put on Jesus, I mentioned the other day, he saved others, himself he cannot save, why should I be out here trying to help these groups who have the help of U.S. senators, U.S. congresspersons. Members of the Legislature, why should I spend time on those issues when they're well-tended to by others, rather than put all of my time on these issues where I'm going to be virtually the only person dealing with them? That is not a wise usage of my time. But, to be quite frank, I didn't expect to run up against quite as solid a wall of indifference as I'm seeing unfold this morning. But I'll tell you what, no matter what occurs, I will survive and I will be here to continue fighting these issues and one way or the other I'm going to win. But I'm going to see how successful my colleagues will be in handling some of these things on their own. Ask me a legal question, I'll say go see your lawyer. Bring me a bill that you don't understand...
