them, and that's what I've told them. Because I have interests of black people and other nonwhites as my priority on this bill and I don't want to dilute my position by bringing up all these other reasons that people are giving me as to why they're opposed to this legislation. They should call the other senators and tell them that. I'm not going to be the funnel and conduit for every grievance that everybody has. And if they choose not to let anybody else know about it, when I say "anybody else" I'm talking about other senators, then the other senators are not going to know. I'm not going to convey all those messages forever. I'm going to do what it is that I must do. Excuse me a second. I see Senator Byars lurking in my area. I'm going to pause for a second, without giving my time up, to see what he has on his mind. Mr. President, what Senator Byars had in mind simply cannot be accomplished at this particular point, but as I see that we're nearing the noonhour, I'm not going to carry us past noon because all that is, is time off my eight hours, and I don't want to give it up for no purpose. So I'm going to terminate my opening at this point.
