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me from you or you from me. Stop signs, speeding, DWIs, all of these are designed to protect an individual from another driver. The seat belt and the helmet are designed to protect the individual from themselves. And I think that we're making mandatory here something that is protecting ourselves. So I do have a little problem with that, and I understand fully where Senator Chambers is coming from. This gives me a little opportunity to talk on a bill that's going to be coming up here, I hope, if it comes out of committee, that deals with quotas in law enforcement, and this will do away with quotas in law enforcement, and this is another good example. If they have quotas, which are allowed now, this would be a good excuse to stop somebody, and what Denny...or what Senator Byars talked about there, the police officer can just stop you now, I am not sure. I am going to have to look at that statute when he passes it around but I was always under the impression that I needed a reason to stop the person. And I agree, yeah, you can stop somebody for crossing the center line or whatever, and you could follow somebody and probably find a reason to do it, but I do believe that you should have a reason to stop somebody and this would give them maybe some more leeway to stop somebody with bad law enforcement. And I am not concluding that every police officer out there is bad. I don't believe that at all. I think a few of them make it very hard on the good ones, but we have had examples of bad policing out there. Wasn't only a few years back where a couple of the Omaha Police officers returning from the academy in Grand Island tied up people on the interstate, and things like that do happen. So I understand where Senator Chambers is coming from on that, but I also understand that Senator Byars is very sincere in his heart what he is trying to do here with this bill. So, with that, I will yield my time to Senator Byars. I want him to address this statute thing a little more. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Schmitt. Senator Byars, you have two minutes.

SENATOR BYARS: Thank you, Mr. President. Thank you, Senator Schmitt. I'm having copied and will have distributed to you now all of those laws that are...can be used by any law enforcement official for...for a legitimate stop. Yes, Senator Schmitt, hopefully, hopefully, there should be foundation for any kind of
