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stop by any law enforcement officer. This gives a laundry list of what they can use now legitimately to make a stop, and my point is that if they want to make a stop of anyone, any citizen of this state, or others, they can do it now. This isn't...we talk about giving them one more opportunity, they don't need one more opportunity. If they want to stop somebody and be discriminatory, they can do it now, and on my own time as we go along, I have some other information that I'd like to share with you. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Byars. Senator Chambers, you're recognized on your bracket motion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. Speaker, I think Senator Byars and those of us who are discussing this bill realize that we're talking for the record and to the people who may be observing us. So for those who are roaming around and doing all that gossiping, your constituents are watching you. They are aware of you and the camera, I've discovered, zooms in on those senators who are roaming around and doing these things. The only reason I'm alerting you to this, I'm the Dean of the Legislature, I'm concerned about the Legislature from an institutional standpoint, so I should make that warning to you. Now you can do with it as you please. But, Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Senator Byars and his staff are barking up the wrong tree. What he is having his staff do is a waste of time. We all know that laws can be used or no law can be used by a cop to make a stop. That's not the issue. The issue is creating a situation wherein every vehicle driven by every person a cop is given a pretense for making the stop. If Senator Byars wanted to say, well, if you have a defective light, not every car is going to have a defective light. Not every car is going to have a dragging muffler. Not every car is going to be too loud. Not everybody is going to drive across the center line or follow too close. But everybody's car has a seat belt or is supposed to have one, and everybody driving a car is a potential target, and that's what Senator Byars and his staff do not want to look at. And Senator Byars told me in the beginning, he's willing to fight this through for 24 hours. He told me that, so we're going to do it, and that's the way he and I started. I laid out the concerns that I have. They were not that significant to him, so we are going to fight it off, and
