SENATOR CHAMBERS: So you cannot confirm for us, as you would have to do in court, that this is an accurate representation of everything contained in the original letter written by the National Urban League?

SENATOR BYARS: That would be hearsay, I think, in a court of law, Senator, and I think that you would have to have Milton Little, himself, to testify it was...
