continue to battle on this bill. Senator Tyson made the comment that I'm doing what I often do, and that's be right for the wrong reasons. Well, I'm sure that if you were a patient who was ill, and the doctor prescribed the proper medication for the wrong reason, you'd be appreciative of that medication. Maybe he is prescribing it or she is prescribing it because it tastes bitter and will make you have an ugly face, and somebody is going to put you on "Candid Camera". But, nevertheless, the underlying purpose and function of the medicine will be served. That's to bring health and healing to a diseased body. What I am doing with my opposition is to try to stop a bill that I think is the equivalent of a virus, a pathogenic virus that would attack the body politic if I don't stop it.

SENATOR BYARS: Thank you, Mr. President. I am waiting patiently for information to be copied so that it can be passed out to you. I gave my only copy to the Pages, so I don't have it to debate from, relative to the reasons that law enforcement officers have, and it certainly is not an all-inclusive list. It is just an example of many of the instances that they can use in that regard. Thank you, Senator Bromm. But I'd like to go over these now and it will show you very clearly that law enforcement officers don't need another reason to stop you if they want to harass you. They don't need an excuse. I think it makes Senator Chambers' arguments totally and absolutely invalid. He has based his entire argument against this bill on the fact that it gives law enforcement officers another opportunity to harass young black Americans. And I think this shows very clearly, in spite of every thing else, why that is not the case, and let me...let me illuminate some of these for you: failure to follow a traffic control device--stop lights; stop signs; yield signs; any other traffic sign that's constructed for the purpose of regulating, warning, or guiding traffic; unauthorized passing on the right; driving left of center of the highway; driving over the center line, however slightly it is done. Can you imagine the areas of fabrication in the minds of a law enforcement official? Certainly, they are there, now. Driving on the shoulder of a highway; driving over the white line, however slightly it is done. How many of you
