PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator. Senator, you're recognized to close on your motion to bracket LB 356.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, and as I stated, the purpose of our exercise today and in the days to come will be just to pass some time. So it doesn't matter whether it is done on this issue, whether I make a motion to reconsider this vote, or just continue with the amendments that I have, we're going to spend the time. But in honor of "Deacon" Jones, and some have been waiting to exhale, I use that a lot now, this that I am going to read is from the Agriculture Committee hearing on February 2nd when we were talking about a series of bills. Senator Jones is speaking. "Thank you, Senator Dierks and members of the Agriculture Committee." Where's Jones? Oh, there he is. "My name is Senator Jim Jones and I represent the 43rd Legislative District." Since he said his name is Senator Jim Jones, I might just call him Mr. Senator, I didn't realize that was his name, but it is. Senator Jim Jones, that's his name. "I've probably got more livestock than anybody else in here, in my district, but I want to be sure to come and testify." Doing like preachers do, they read from the scriptures, then they comment, Senator Jones, I bet I've got more black people in my district than anybody in here and I want to be sure that I speak on these issues. Going back to Senator Jones' testimony: "I come before you today in support of LB 832, 834, and 833, and 835," they are a little out of order, but that's the way he said it, "all four of them. Nebraska farmers and ranchers need a level playing field." And I agree, and I agreed that day, and I think Senator Jones knows it. "I think we just have lost that, and so I think we need it. The four bills here is the first step in the right direction, I think, to what we want. My ranch has lost money during the...each year for the last three years. I have a calf-to-finish operation, and when I get ready to sell my cattle when they're finished, I ask a packer to come and look at them, and they say, well, it looks like you need to wait a week or something," putting him off to take advantage of him.
