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SENATOR LYNCH: Oh.

SENATOR REDFIELD: ...at all.

SENATOR LYNCH: Oh.

SENATOR REDFIELD: That's why I'm not comfortable with the words of the bill.

SENATOR LYNCH: But what you're saying is the job...the bill does not say that if you don't pay your fair share you got to quit, does it? Does it?

SENATOR REDFIELD: It's saying you have to pay the fair share, you have no choice.

SENATOR LYNCH: Does it say you have to quit? That's my question. Does it say you have to quit, yes or no, that's all? I mean...

SENATOR REDFIELD: It says you must pay your fair share...

SENATOR LYNCH: I know it...I know that, Senator Redfield,...

SENATOR REDFIELD: ...or you can go to court...

SENATOR LYNCH: ...but will you tell me. You're the one that said "quit". Does the bill say that either you pay your fair share or you have to quit, yes or no?

SENATOR REDFIELD: The only way to escape your obligation...

SENATOR LYNCH: Well, obviously,...

SENATOR REDFIELD: ...is to quit.

SENATOR LYNCH: ...no, you don't want to answer the question, so that's all right. The other thing I would like to comment on, you mentioned something about it's too bad that law does not apply where a person who...oh, well, you mentioned you like to exempt the requirement that unions have to represent everyone
