I believe this bill is directed against these, as they used to call them in the old days of "no nothingism", the "fureigners". The "fureigners" are coming. The "fureigners" are coming. Make sure they speak English too, because you're going to have to take an examination. Even though you could show and demonstrate that you can do this nail work better than anybody currently licensed, if you don't know English well enough to pass this examination, you're through. You cannot partake of this profession. And, brothers and sisters, there is no need to regulate all of these types of activities in this manner. Tattoooing is far more intrusive and it is not regulated. You don't have to have a license to tattoo. You don't have to have a license to punch holes in people's body as long as you don't do it in anger. If you do it in anger it's (laugh) assault with a deadly weapon. But if they voluntarily stick their tongue out there in a clamp and you want to put a cork under it and take a tenpenny nail and set it on top of it and hit it with a ball-peen hammer and drive that nail right through the tongue into the cork, and the person agrees to it, you're all right. If you want to take an ice pick and punch a hole in somebody's ear, you're all right; or punch it through the septum of the nose, it's okay. But doing something that women do for themselves, and even some men now, by the way, and I don't mean necessarily that they're gay. They put on fingernail polish, they buff their nails and they want to look whatever that makes them look like, and I'm in favor of that, because the more attention they pay to it, their nails, the more likely they are to clean out those little...you know, some people's nails look like crescent moons on top, little crescent moons of soil at the top of their fingers because they don't clean under their fingernails. Well, if they put some fingernail polish on it they're going to say, hey, I need to clean that dirt out from under my nail. (Laugh) Quit looking at your nails. They're going to say I got to clean that dirt out from under my nails. Then they'll say, if I'm going to go to all that trouble, I may as well wash my hands too. So that's a strike in favor of hygiene, which I'm very much in favor of. There are other things that I find unsatisfactory in this bill but I cannot mention them all during this ten minutes of
